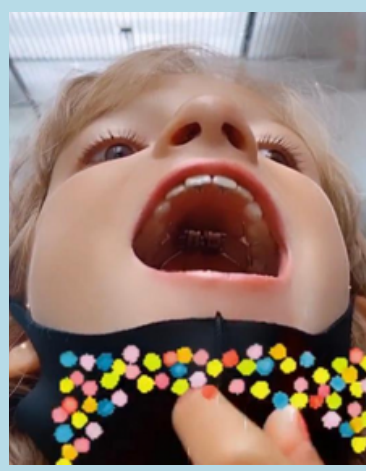
## NEW PROTOCOLS FOR PATIENT COMFORT AND SAFETY

## PREVENTIVE ORTHODONTICS: KEEPING KIDDOS SMILING SO DENTAL PROBLEMS DON'T GET WORSE!

You're only young once, so time to make that orthodontist appointment for your kiddos. Phase 1 of Orthodontic Treatment sometimes called Preventive or INTERCEPTIVE Phase.



Typically between 7 to 9 and ½ years of age, a child's bone is soft as a sponge and skeletal sutures are

still open, making it easier for the Orthodontist to guide upper and lower jaws into the correct position utilizing various appliances. If parents wait to correct these abnormalities in children, they risk more intensive corrections as the child grows.
